## Foreign Exchange Expenditures' Movement Analysis

### From 1/1 – to 30/06/2024

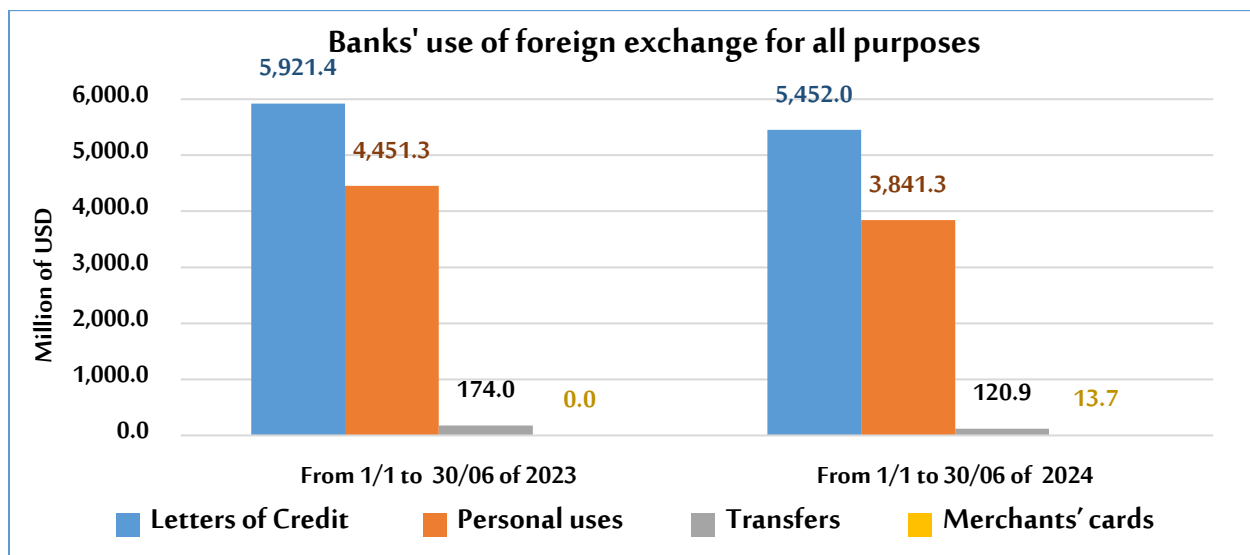
The total uses of foreign exchange by banks from 1/1 – to 30/06/2024 amounted to about \$9,427,883,439 compared to \$10,546,710,539 during the same period of 2023, which is a decline of about \$1,132,511,101, with a rate of 10.6%.

The letters of credit accounted for 57.8% of total bank uses of foreign exchange, personal purposes accounted for 40.7% of total bank uses of foreign exchange, while transfers accounted for only 1.4% of total uses.

### **Amounts sold to banks in foreign exchange for all purposes:**

According to the table below, which illustrates the values sold of foreign exchange by banks, it is clear that [National Commercial Bank](#) was the most bank purchased foreign exchange from 1/1 – to 30/06/2024 with a market share of 15.9%, as the total amounts of foreign exchange purchased was about \$1,497,213,905 followed by [Aman Bank for Trade and Investment](#) with a value of \$1,276,256,312, then [Jumhouria Bank](#) was in the third place with a value of \$1,244,220,069. Then [Wahda Bank](#) was ranked in fourth place with a value of \$889,186,707, then the following banks come in terms of relative importance in order: [Nuran Bank, the United Bank, Libyan Islamic Bank, Sahara Bank, and Bank of Commerce and Development](#), as shown in the table below, which also contains the order in which banks were in the same period of 2023.

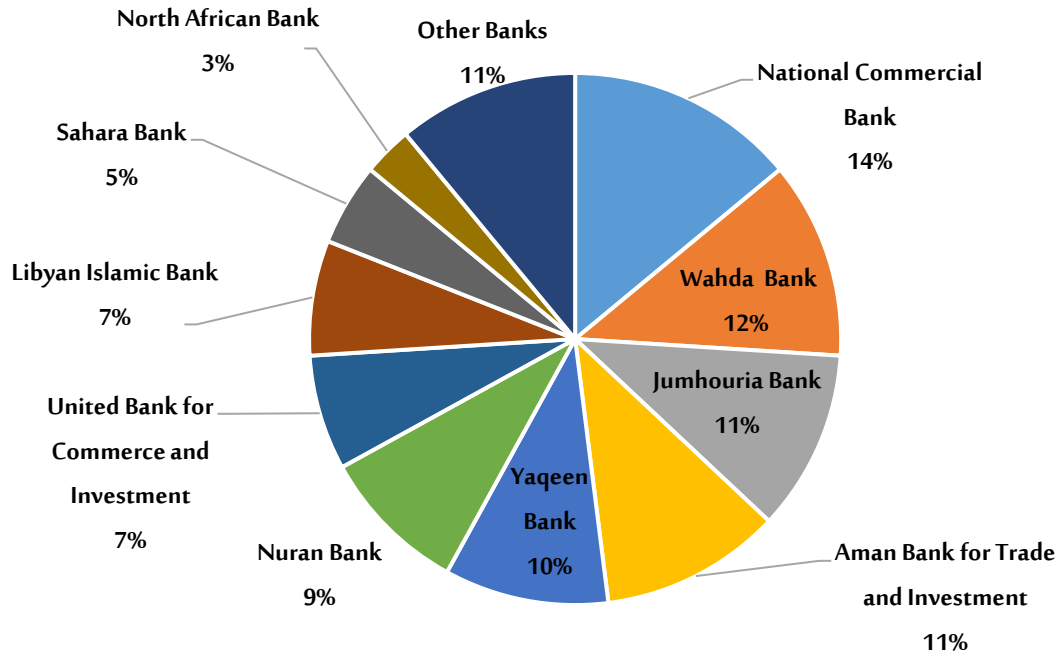

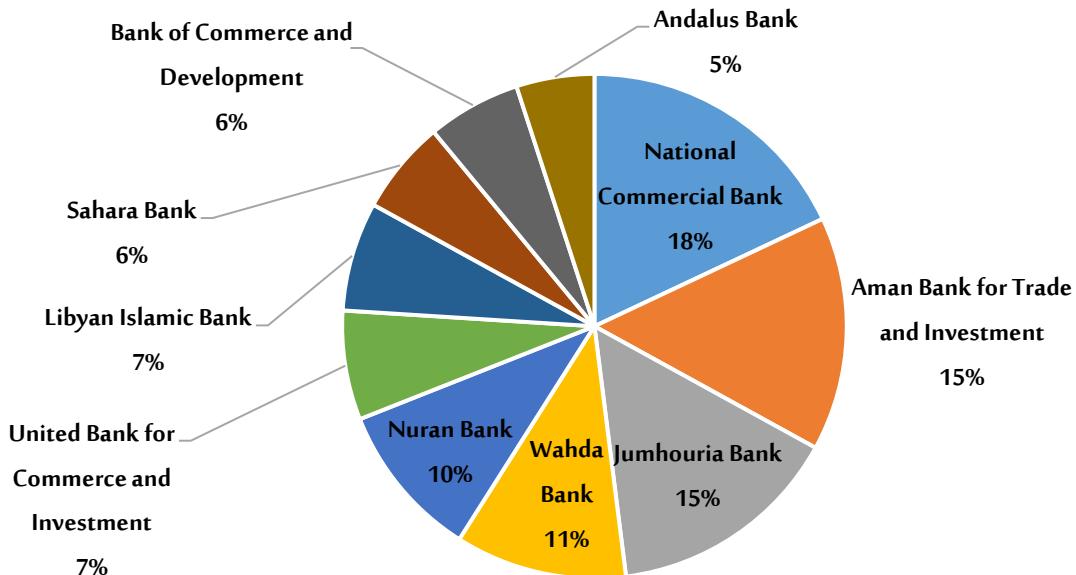

**Accepted banks' requests to cover Letters of Credit and transfers, except for personal purposes, from 1/1 – to 30/06/2024:**

The number of companies, factories, public entities, and other entities whose applications were approved to purchase foreign exchange from 1/1 – to 30/06/2024 has reached (1,809), with a number of total requests amounting to 7,811 applications. Most of these applications were made in purpose to cover letters of credit, which were 6,956 applications, 89.1% of the total applications, as shown in the following tables:

## 1. Private Sector

The number of private sector companies and factories reached (1,724) whose requests for foreign exchange from banks to cover Letters of credit and other transfers were approved during the period (1/1 - until 30/06/2024), where requests for the purchase of foreign exchange by the private sector to import Miscellaneous Food Commodities ranked first of the total purchase requests during the period, constituting 29.4% of the total foreign exchange purchase requests. As for private sector companies, Allebeeyah Al Mutaheda Beverage Bottling Company ranked first during the period. 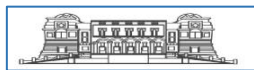

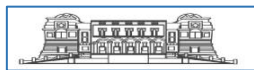

The table below shows the values of banks' foreign exchange orders by country of origin of goods or services during the period (1/1 - 30/06/2024) of the private sector. The goods or services of Turkish origin ranked first and accounted for 19.2% of the total accepted purchase orders, imports of goods or services of Chinese origin were second attributed to 11.4% of the total. While, goods or services of Egypt origin ranked third and accounted for 7.4%, and goods and services of Russian origin represented 6.8% of the total. The goods and services of Indian origin accounted for 6.0% of the total. The following table shows the 20 most important countries of origin for goods or services.

## 2. Public Sector

The number of public sector entities whose applications for foreign exchange to cover letters of credit and other transfers were approved reached **30 entities** during the period (1/1 - until 30/06/2024), where the Iron and Steel Factory's requirements ranked first of the total purchase orders during the period, as it constituted 42.0% of the total foreign exchange purchase requests, while the Production and operation requirements ranked the second place in terms of relative importance to constitute about 13.2%. Therefore, the Libyan Iron and Steel Company ranked first, as its accepted requests for the purchase of foreign exchange recorded about \$225.8 Million, followed by Libyana Mobile Phone Company with total acceptable requests of \$66.1 million, and the following tables show requests for the purchase of goods or services as well as purchase orders by public entities during the period (1/1 – until 30/06/2024).
